Hotel Synopsis: COMO Uma Canggu

In February 2018, COMO Hotels and Resorts — the name behind private island resorts like COMO Parrot Cay in the Turks and Caicos, and adventure retreats like COMO Uma Ubud in Bali and COMO Uma, Bhutan — opened COMO Uma Canggu. This new resort sits at the edge of the sand in Canggu, with panoramic views of the Indian Ocean's rolling waves and some impressive rocks, named Batu Mejan ('batu' means 'rock' and 'mejan' means 'very big' in Balinese — we also named a suite after this rock formation). Canggu is a coastal region located on the southern coast of Bali, Indonesia. The area, approximately 10 kilometres north of the bustling Kuta district, has a relaxed atmosphere where visitors can enjoy many dining experiences and cultural activities. Canggu is also renowned for its undulating rice paddies and challenging surfing beaches.

COMO Uma Canggu offers 52 Rooms and Suites, 55 One- and Two-Bedroom Residences, and 12 Three-Bedroom COMO Penthouses with arched openings over their decks and private pools. The style is contemporary, with lots of white and full-length windows to make the resort feel like it is soaked in Indian Ocean light.

Five buildings that house our Residences — Akasa, Apah, Bayu, Pertiwi and Teja — are named after words in the Sanskrit language. 'Akasa' means 'of the space' or 'clear sky' in Sanskrit, 'apah' means 'of the water', 'bayu' means 'of the wind', 'pertiwi' means 'of the earth' and 'teja' means 'of the fire'.

Everything about this resort conspires to encourage easy living with an elegant edge. The oceanside setting instils spirit into the resort's entire offering, from the COMO Beach Club, which is a modern twist on the traditional surf shack, to the airy COMO Shambhala Retreat, which has two yoga studios. The wellness centre offers eight discrete treatment rooms — including two double rooms for couples treatments. 'Jungle Sport' sessions will also be available here for the first time in Bali. This TRX-style exercise uses suspension equipment to tone and build muscles, as well as provide an extensive cardio workout.

The resorts also has glow juice bar, a healthy 'grab and go' bar for fresh, cold-pressed juices, smoothies, snacks and tasty salads, while the main restaurant at COMO Beach Club focuses on wood-fired dishes, with Indian Ocean seafood a key feature on the menus. It has panoramic views of Echo Beach, making it the perfect spot to watch the sunset with a cocktail.

There is also a Play by COMO facility to keep younger guests engaged. At the dedicated Play by COMO Space, open daily between 9.00am and 6.00pm, the aim is to inspire purposeful and creative child-directed play for children aged four to 12. Each toy, book, game and art material has been carefully selected to encourage sensory development, curiosity and imagination.

To add to this, the beach in front of the hotel is a haven for both families and surfers, with plenty of spots for swimming, and some of the best surf breaks on the island. Tropicsurf, the pioneers of luxury surfing, are on hand to offer lessons in everything from fundamental balance skills to tackling the island's toughest waves. Hour-long or week-long courses are available for individuals, children and families. COMO Uma Canggu can also organise a number of excursions for those who prefer dry land, from walks through the rustling rice paddies of Canggu, to visiting iconic landmarks such as the sea temple of Tanah Lot.



For events, COMO Uma Canggu adds a personal touch to every experience, whether a wedding, birthday, honeymoon or corporate gathering. There is an array of event venues to choose from, including the

sophisticated COMO Penthouse for smaller gatherings, and the COMO Beach Club Lawn for up to 100 people standing or 40 people seated.

Surfing

COMO Uma Canggu works with luxury surf pioneers, Tropicsurf, to offer easy access to some of Bali's most sought-after breaks. The resident Tropicsurf guides cater for guests of all abilities — from lagoon training, where fundamental balance skills are taught, through to expert instruction on tackling some of the toughest breaks in Bali.

Sightseeing in Tanah Lot

Tanah Lot is made up of sea temples standing on tide-shaped rocks on the west coast of Bali. This holy site is a popular place from which to see the spectacular sunset. According to lore, these sea temples were built by priest Niratha, who asked a poisonous sea snake to guard the holy temple.

Ubud Discovery Tour

This tour is designed around three key elements of Balinese culture: spirituality, art, and trade — taking you through galleries, temples, local shops and the rice terraces of Ubud.

Purification Ceremony at Tirta Empul

Take part in a traditional Balinese purification ceremony at the historic Tirta Empul temple in north-east Ubud. You can making and present offerings, recite traditional prayers, dress in temple attire and watch the holy water rituals.



Destination Overview: COMO Uma Canggu, Bali

Bali is considered to be the jewel of Indonesia — the original paradise cliché filled with smiling faces, white-sand beaches and unspoilt, rolling countryside carpeted in velvet green fields of rice paddies. It is all of this, but more as well, its manifold layers created by a long-standing, sophisticated culture informed by a deep sense of religion and respect for tradition.

A volcanic mountain chain splices the island in two. To the east lies Sidemen — a heavenly rural enclave in the shadow of Mount Agung — and to the south, the busier beach enclaves of Seminyak, Kuta and Nusa Dua, while Ubud, revered as the island's cultural hub, lies at its heart. The less visited north and west of Bali includes a quiet coastline that's ideal for diving.

Most significant to its extraordinary culture is the fact Bali stands as the only predominantly Hindu island in the world's largest Muslim nation – Indonesia. Hinduism was introduced from Java in the eighth century and then strengthened in the 15th century as the Brahman priests fled the Islamic encroachment on Java. From these early roots, Bali has developed its own unique system of beliefs, officially called 'Agama Tirtha' (literally, 'Religion of Holy Water').

Balinese people believe in the seen and the unseen worlds. Life is a battle between the demons and dark forces that dwell in the sea and the gods who reside in the mountains, or the volcanoes, which are such a dominant feature of the island's topography.

Village life is a core element of Balinese culture — a cohesive religious community ('banjar') organised around a group of temples. Each banjar member is duty-bound to take part in rituals and assist in ceremonies, involving art, music, theatre and elaborate offerings. These ceremonies constitute the island's heartbeat. Indeed, the very soul of Bali is rooted in religion and is expressed in art forms that have been well preserved over the centuries. Hindu tenets have also morphed with local influences. Dance dramas, for example, are based on the old Hindu epics of the Ramayana and the Mahabharata, but contain elements of folklore peculiar to the island.

Although the ancient regencies of the 'Rajas' and princes of Bali were dismantled by colonial governments in the early 20th century, many of the royal descendants, who still own traditional palaces, are very much respected as patrons of the arts. Even today, it seems that almost every person is a painter, carpenter or weaver, with beauty found in the smallest decorations made for the myriad shrines found across the island, from temple shrines to paddy fields. To find out more about Bali's land and culture, guests of COMO Uma Canggu can experience its vibrancy by taking advantage of the resort's highly informed local staff.
