Getting There:	COMO Laucala Island, Fiji, is a 12 square kilometre private island in a remote corner of Melanesia, accessed by a 55-minute private air charter from the country's Nadi International Airport.
	COMO Laucala Island has its own airstrip for private planes, and can arrange 55-minute connecting flights from Nadi International Airport on resort-owned planes.
	At Nadi International Airport, the resort owns a private lounge for guest assistance, where guests can wait with refreshments, fully taken care of by our team.
	International arrivals may land at Laucala Airport at additional cost. The cost will cover customs, immigration and quarantine clearance, to be arranged in direct liaison with the COMO Laucala Island reservations team.

Hotel Synopsis: COMO Laucala Island

COMO Laucala Island is a Fijian private island encircled by a dramatic reef with exceptional diving and snorkeling, rich with forest, flowers and healing natural plants. Every day, guests will encounter ruby-red land crabs, butterflies, and birds dipping their wings mid-flight into the island's numerous private swimming pools.

The resort has 25 Residences occupying a 22km-long walking trail, threaded around the island's edge. Each home is designed to reflect the Fijian soul. All the Residences are sea-facing — some on the beaches, some peeking out from the forest canopy behind. The architecture combines soft curves and free-flowing shapes, thatch roofs made from the leaves of sago palms, dogo timber, balabala fern stems and traditional coconut husk weave known as magimagi.

The resort also features five restaurants that include healthy COMO Shambhala options. Flavour, health, wellbeing and self-sustainability are core values to the dining experience, which is reflected in the island's own cattle and poultry farm, hydroponics, herb garden and fruit orchards. The resort also works with local growers on nearby Taveuni Island (popularly known as 'The Garden Isle').

Given so much space, the range of resort activities on offer always exceed the length of a guest's stay, including hiking, mountain biking and swimming Laucala's horses on an ocean bareback ride. The walking trails wind among giant banyans and rare Fijian hardwoods threaded with pink hibiscus, orchids, and flamboyant wild gingers. The inshore marine environment at Laucala is equally thriving, with seagrass forests, mangroves and sunken calderas for wall diving. There are up to 50 dive sites within a five-to 20-minute boat ride of the main resort. And boats of every kind: for fishing, sailing, and sunset cruising.

The resort's spa, COMO Shambhala Retreat, is located in the forested heart of the island, among the tropical flowers and fruit trees. Body treatments use the island's river stones, mineral crystals and rich volcanic soils. The Fijian therapists are full of soul and experience, with an intuitive healing philosophy handed down through the generations.

Beyond the Resort: Activities at COMO Laucala Island

COMO Laucala Island is an extraordinary natural playground, with a topographical variety both above and below water that is unique in private island resorts. To start your adventure, we recommend our two-hour scenic farm tour, to gain an understanding of our island's incredible abundance. The tour takes guests through the our herb garden, flower garden, fruit orchard, nursery, farms and stables – with many glimpses of ocean and jungle along the way.

The inshore marine environment includes seagrass forests, healthy mangroves on the south and east coast of the island, and a popular fish breeding area off the northeast shore. This inner reef life is bound by a barrier reef, which encircles both Laucala and the adjacent inhabited island of Qamea. Beyond this edge lie sunken calderas for wall diving. There are more than 50 snorkelling sites in the safe waters of the inner reef, while the world-class Rainbow Reef is a 40-minute boat ride away. From June to October, humpback and sperm whales migrate past Laucala to breed. From November to April, whale sharks gather around Laucala's waters, drawn by the summer plankton. Through November and December, you can see the corals bloom and spawn.

We offer PADI-certified dive instruction for all levels, including Bubblemaker for children (ages eight+), Open Water and Night Dive certifications. Please note no dives can take place within 24 hours of air travel. Guests can also jetski around the island with a Fijian guide, learning about local legends along the way.

Our Riviera Open Flybridge can be chartered for deep sea game fishing excursions. Whether you're a beginner looking for expert-led coaching or an experienced fisher hoping to land one of Fiji's famous yellowfin tuna, the waters beyond the lagoons offer an abundance of blue marlin, black marlin, wahoo, Pacific sailfish, giant trevally and dolphin fish.

Laucala's forested interior, with its dramatic vine and fern-covered basaltic peaks, is a birders' dream: home to the endemic orange dove, the brilliant blue kingfisher, and the striking red and green-collared lory. It is like walking through a tropical arboretum, the forest hiking and mountain-biking paths snaking along the cliffs and into the interior, through giant banyans and rare Fijian hardwoods threaded with pink hibiscus, orchids, and flamboyant wild gingers.

We have three hikes on marked paths, which you can do with or without a guide: our advanced Summit Hike (two hours), which loops up to the highest point on a marked path, our intermediate Tower Hike (one hour), with spectacular westward views, and our intermediate Round-the-Island Hike (four hours) which follows the coastal path, with the sea nearly always in sight. There are multiple lookout points for rest stops and picnics. We can also provide guides to teach you more about the local greenery – including their use as medicinal herbs – on your trail.

For an off-site adventure, take a 30-minute boat ride to the nearby Taveuni island. Go on an exhilarating three-and-a-half hour hike with rope-guided river crossings in the Bouma National Park



to the Tavoro Falls: a series of three spectacular waterfalls with natural pools to swim in. This is a full-day excursion and we can prepare a picnic lunch for the group.

One of our most unique land activities is horseriding on the 'Long Beach' or through coconut plantations. Our horses are crossbreeds of Australian Thoroughbreds (bred for the Melbourne race track) and British Clydesdales (used for the plantations). Equestrians can go out on hacks around the island, canter 'Long Beach' at low tide, and swim bareback in the ocean. Our resident 'Horse Whisperer' looks after the stables and provides classes in an enclosed riding arena. Closed-toe shoes are required, and the minimum guest age is eight.

We also have a 18-hole Championship Course carefully set in the old plantation, surrounded by Laucala's dramatic mountains. Designed by Scotsman David McLay Kidd, this par-72 course is challenging for experienced players, but with a variety of tee box options, is also inviting to those new to the game. The par-5 12th hole is the signature hole: the green extends on to the beach. Any number of games is complimentary.
